

**n Indoor Air Survey Summary**  
**Research Center: Dr. Ron Langley, Director**  
**August 2006**

1.) Hello, my name is \_\_\_\_\_ from the University of Kentucky Survey Research Center. I am calling today to ask for your participation in a short survey about what Jessamine County residents think about indoor smoking in public places. The interview should take only a few minutes, and your answers will help us get an accurate view of what the public thinks. Your phone number was randomly selected and we do not have your name so all of your answers will be anonymous. According to my instructions, I am to talk to the person at this number who is age 18 or older and has had the most recent birthday. Would that be you? Or would you please call this person to the phone?  
Total Respondents = 1011 (501 Never Smoked + 510 Have Ever Smoked (293 Former Smokers and 217 Current Smokers))

2.) If I have your permission, let me begin by verifying that you do live in Jessamine County, is that correct?  
Yes = 100% - they did not continue if they said ñnoö.

3.) Do you live in the City of Nicholasville?  
Yes = 66.2% No = 33.8%

4.) The first few questions I would like to ask have to do with smoking and tobacco policy. Let's start with your opinion regarding smoking in public places. For each type of establishment I mention, please tell me whether you think there should be no restrictions on smoking, certain areas set aside for smoking, or whether smoking should be banned entirely. Let's start with (go to question #5):
