“Jessamine County Fall Haul Offers Safe Disposal of Hazardous Household Wastes”

On Saturday, November 5 from 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Jessamine County Fiscal Court and Jessamine County Environmental Services will host the 2011 Fall Haul— an event designed to offer county residents the opportunity to dispose of hazardous household wastes.

Hazardous items that will be accepted during the event include paint, paint thinner, antifreeze, pesticides, pool cleaners, electronic waste, and more. According to Environmental Services Director Mike Cassidy, a large number of every day household materials should be considered hazardous— including some unexpected items such as moth balls, kitchen and bathroom cleaning materials, and even arts and crafts supplies.

“Our goal is to help people get rid of hazardous household materials without harming the environment,” Cassidy said.
